

What leaves your computer, and what never does.

Churches ask this before they install anything, and they are right to. Here is the complete list. **Your full recording is not on it.**

THE COMPLETE LIST

WHAT	GOES UP?	WHY
Your full recording	Never	It is read where it sits. There is no export and no upload of the video.
The audio	Yes	So the words can be transcribed. Only the stretch you asked us to analyse, not the whole file.
Your finished clips	Yes	So they appear in your library and on the web, next to everything else.
Short segments of the chosen clips	Only if needed	If your computer cannot render locally, just those pieces go up so the cloud can make the clips. Never the whole recording.

If your machine renders locally, the video never leaves it at all. Only the audio goes out, and only the finished clips come back up to your library. See the install sheet for which machines qualify.

HOW MUCH DATA IS THAT?

The audio is made small on purpose before it is sent: mono, and compressed to 64 kbps. That works out at about 0.5 MB per minute.

YOU ANALYSE	AUDIO SENT	ROUGHLY
A 40 minute sermon	about 19 MB	About a minute of a video call
A 60 minute sermon	about 29 MB	About a minute of video call
A 2 hour service, untrimmed	about 58 MB	Twice the data, and twice the talks

Setting the window helps both. Everything outside it is never transcribed, so it is never sent.

On a metered connection, use a machine that renders locally. Then only audio goes up. If the cloud renders, short video segments go up as well.

COMMON QUESTIONS

Do you keep the audio?

It is sent so the words can be transcribed. What is retained, and for how long, is set out in the privacy policy at reeluse.com.

Is this different from the website?

Yes. The website works from a link, so the platform's copy is used. The desktop app works from your own file.
